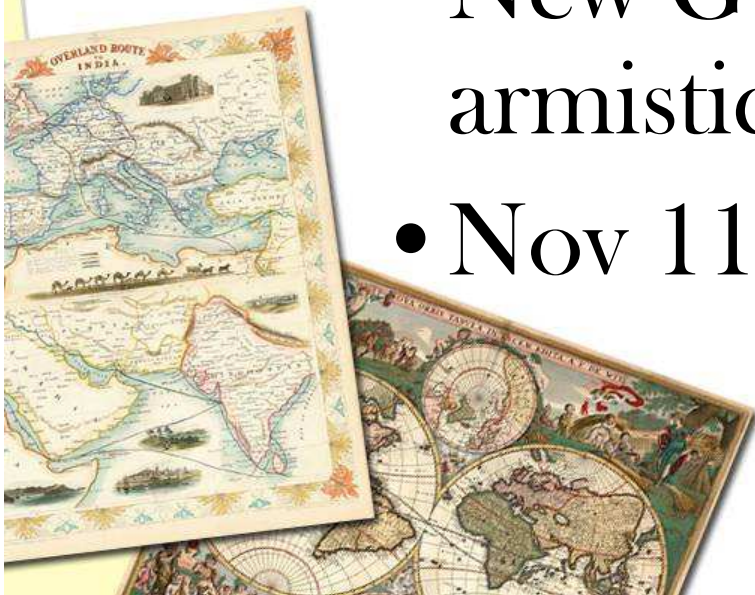
# 14 Points

- Issued by Wilson Jan 1918
- Freedoms
  - seas, free trade
- End to secret treaties
- Large scale arms reductions
- Self-determination
- “General association of nations” to keep future peace



# Germany @ end of WWI

- German forces forced back
- G could not win the war
- Kaiser William II abdicates Nov 1918
- New G government seeks armistice
- Nov 11, 1918– WWI ends



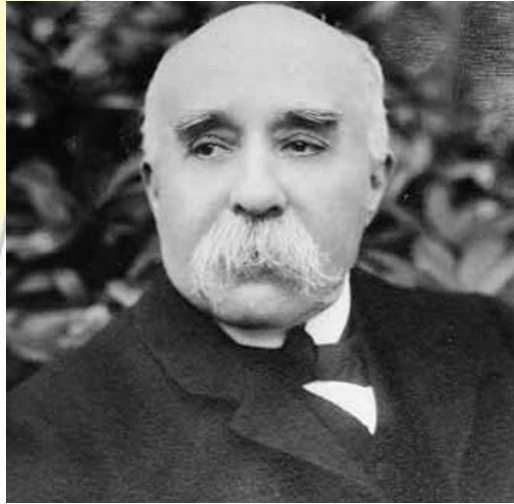


# Paris Peace Conference

- Goal: Make Germany Pay! Germany has to be stopped from invading again.

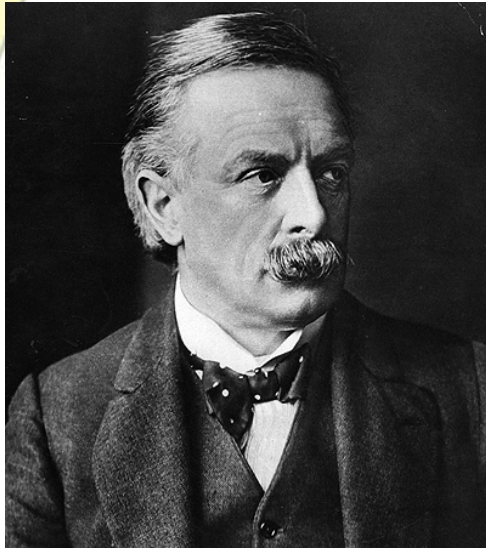
## REVENGE

- Quote: “Mr. Wilson bores me with his Fourteen Points”



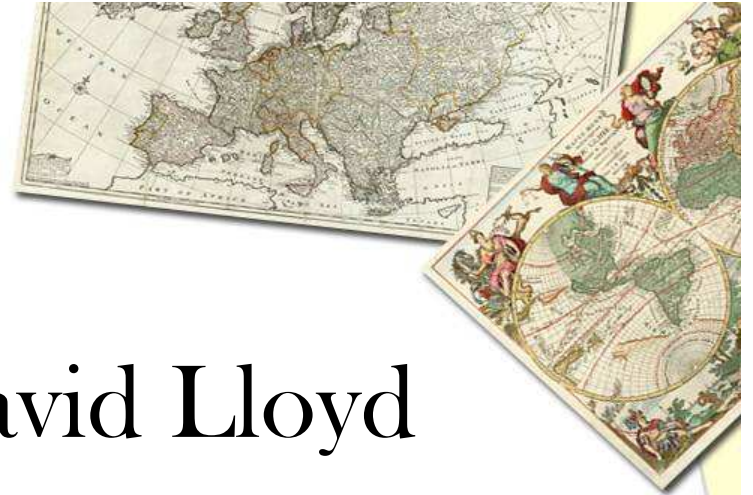


# Great Britain

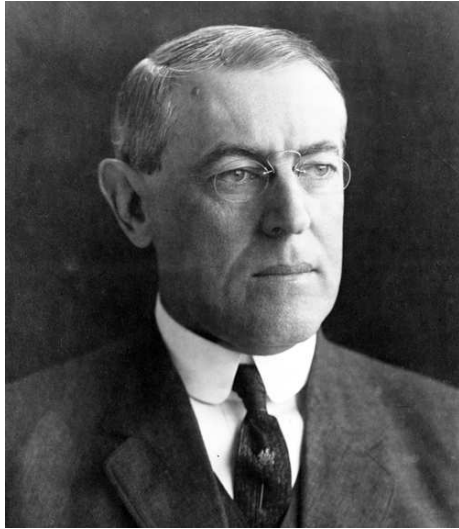

- Goal: Similar to French, but worried that too harsh a treaty might cause hostility in the future
- Quote: build post-war UK “fit for heroes”

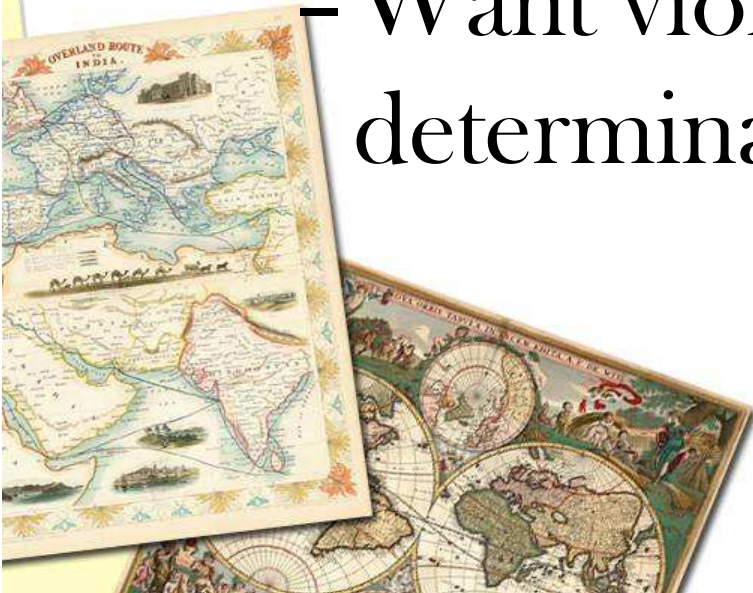
- Leader: Woodrow Wilson

- Quote: “Peace without victory”





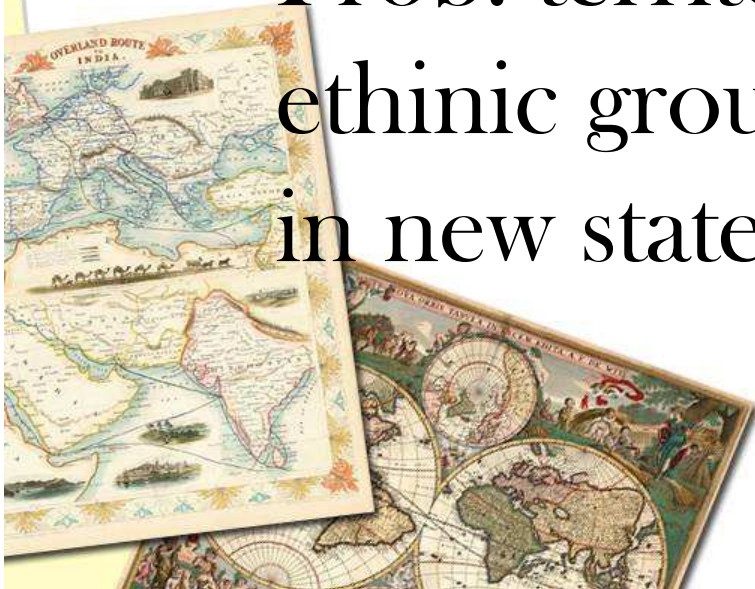
# Other Plans

- Vittorio Orlando (Italy)
  - Allies to honor secret treaty to give A-H lands to Italy
  - Want violated 14 Pts self-determination





- Territories ruled by Russia, A-H, Ottoman Empire demanded own national states
  - Prob: territories overlapped & ethnic groups unwanted minorities in new states

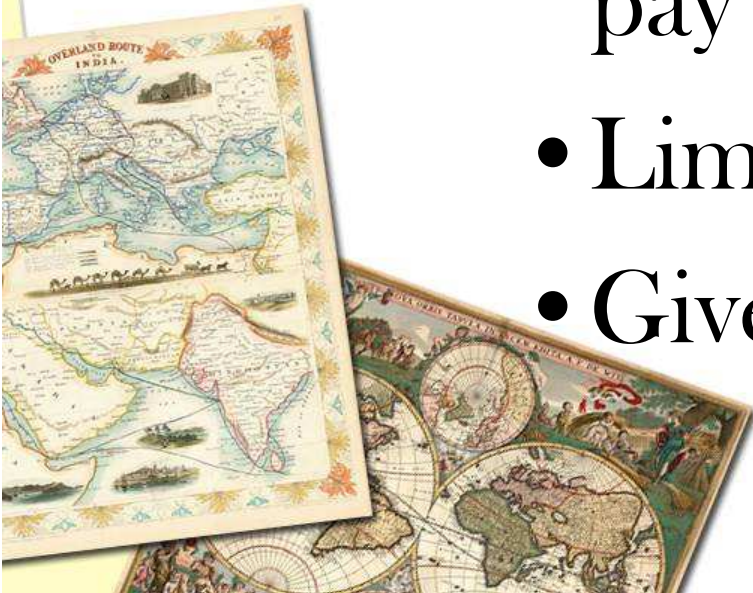
- Germans upset at treaty





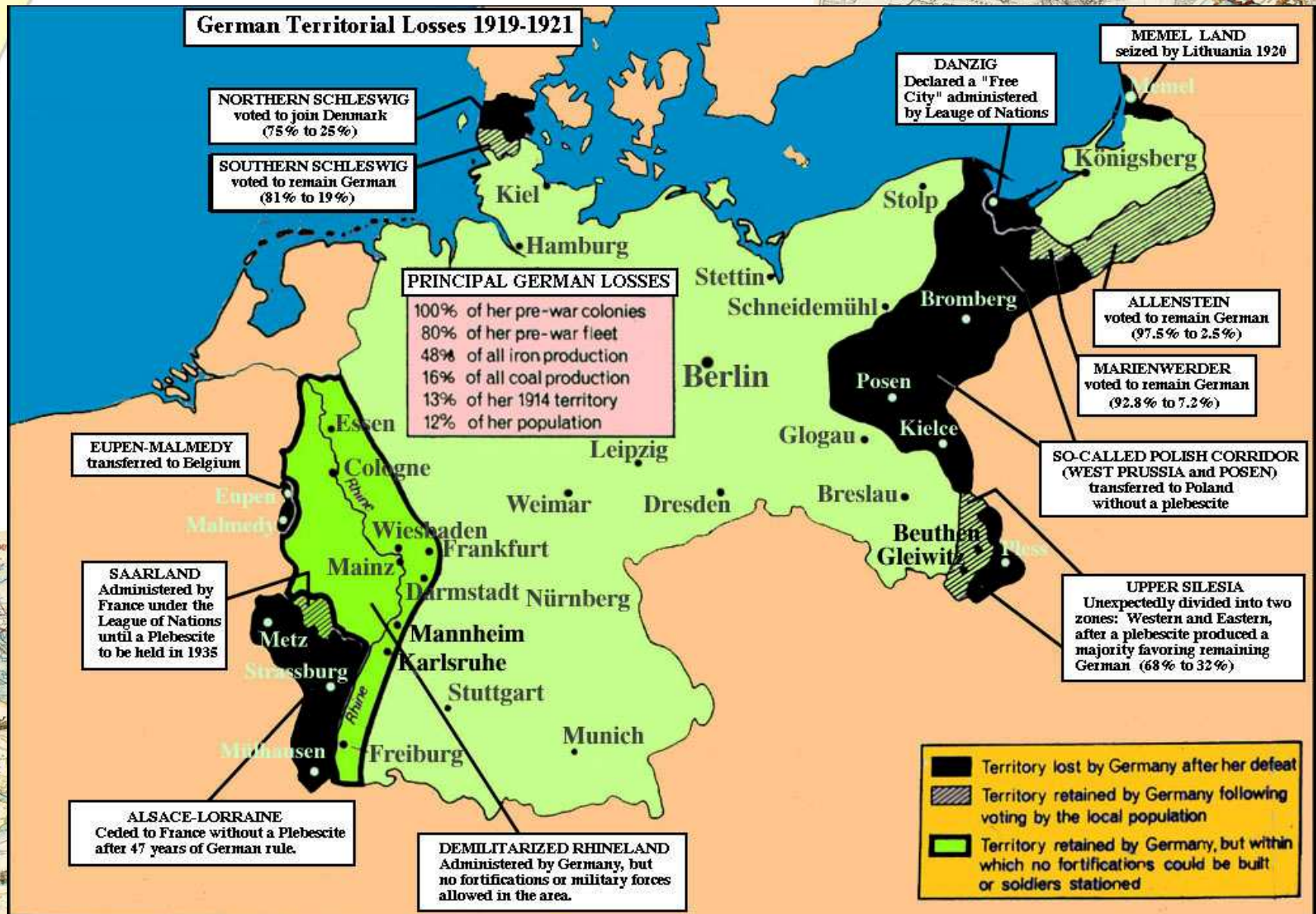
# Germany Agrees to:

- Accept blame for the war & pay reparations
- Limit size of its military
- Give up its empire

# New Nations: 1923



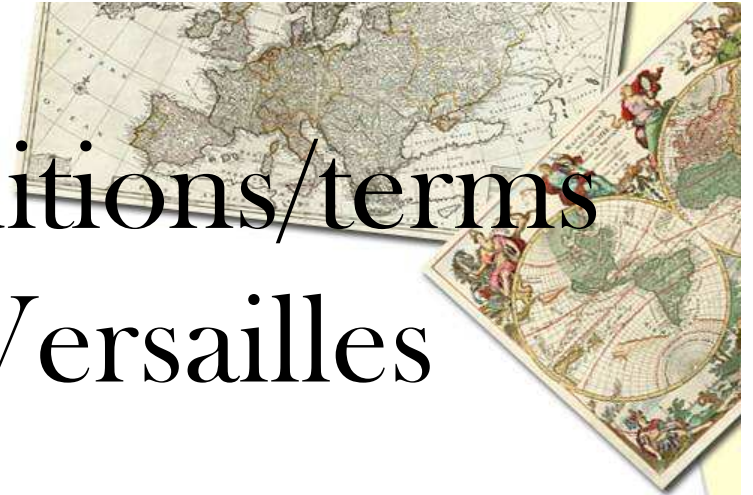



## After World War I

Issue	Treaty Settlement	Problems
War Debt	Because of the treaty, the new German Republic had to make large payments to pay for damage caused by the war.	These payments would hurt an already damaged German economy.
Fear of German Strength	The treaty limited the size of the German military.	Germans resented the treaty demands.
Nationalism	The treaty created new states.	Some ethnic groups became unwanted minorities in the new states.
Colonies and Other Non-European Territories	The treaty created a system of mandates.	Mandates added to imperial rule instead of ending it.
League of Nations	The treaty established the League of Nations.	The United States did not join, thereby weakening the League's power.
