10.8 World War Two Inquiry

Students will utilize their text book and the internet to examine and analyze World War Two. Students will create the following items:

* Aggression annotated timeline

Use Chapter 18, section 1 to create a timeline of acts of aggression from 1930 to 1939. Include a description of the event

* Annotated key battle maps- Europe & Pacific theatres

Create a map of Europe and a map of the Pacific. Locate/id and describe the following conflicts/events: Dunkirk, El Alamein, Midway, Guadalcanal, Pearl Harbor, Normandy, Casablanca, Midway, Iwo Jima, Hiroshima, Nagasaki, Stalingrad, Britain,, Bataan

* Post-War graphic organizer with brief descriptions of key events/effects

Create a graphic organizer of important post war events discussed in Chapter 18, section 5. You may use the model on the section heading page or construct your own. Give a brief description of the event as well.

Students will be evaluated on the following rubric:
